



## Clarence R. Hudspeth

August 30, 1922 - February 21, 2006

Clarence R. Hudspeth went to be with his Lord on February 21, 2006. He was born on August 30, 1922 to Charles and Claudia Hudspeth in Abbott, Arkansas. He was a member of the United States Army and served his country during WWII while assigned to anti-aircraft units in General Patton's Third Army. He saw action in Normandy, France during the Battle of the Bulge and Germany. He received four Bronze Stars and was honorably discharged in 1945. Clarence married Helen on January 19, 1943. He became a Christian 54 years ago at a revival in Ft. Smith Arkansas. He loved building things, helping others, and serving God as a Deacon in his Church.

He was a member of the First Baptist Church of Lindsay, Oklahoma.

Clarence is preceded in death by his parents, his wife Helen who passed away on January 28, 2006, and one son, Steve Hudspeth, one brother, Charles Hudspeth, and one sister, Polly.
