December 23, 1916 - January 22, 2009

Clifford Benjamin Ball departed this life on January 22, 2009 in Norman, Oklahoma at the age of 92. Mr. Ball was a resident of Pauls Valley, Oklahoma, formerly of Alex, Oklahoma.

Clifford was born on December 23, 1916 in El Reno, Oklahoma to Benjamin Bradford Ball and Alva Mary (McDonald) Ball. On January 26th, 1940, Clifford married Alma Othea Eatmon in Guthrie, Oklahoma.
