



## Cynthia Ann Malicoat

Cynthia Ann (Terry) Malicoat was raised in Lindsay, Oklahoma and was a proud 1969 alumna of Lindsay High School. Five years after graduation, she started a day care that she ran for ten years. God gave her the greatest gift in 1972—a son named Christopher Scott Malicoat.

In 1987, she began college at USAO for the first time and graduated with honors in 1990. She set out to fulfill her life's dream of becoming a teacher. Others immediately noticed that she undeniably had a heart destined for helping children. Her dream came true when, two days before school started, she received a call from Dwight Luttrell, inviting her to teach fifth grade at Cyril. She founded the Elementary Academic Team and coached the Curriculum Team for several years. Cynthia served as President of CEA and Vice-President and Treasurer of the Booster Club. She was Pirate Fan of the Year twice mainly because of her "Pirate Blue Punch" and "State Cake" that she loved to serve to Pirate athletes. She taught twenty-five years at Cyril before retiring in 2016.

She was preceded in death by her mother, Hazel Terry, and father, Max Terry. She is survived by the loves of her life: her son, Scott, daughter-in-law, Karri, and four grandchildren, Brayden, Brayley, Destani and her husband, Cameron Capps. Several other close family members survive her as well, including one brother, Mike Terry, his wife, Mitzi, and Cynthia's niece, Marcé, and her husband, Chad, and nephew, Matt, and his wife, Rachel. She also has a great-niece, Landry, and two great-nephews, Kamden and Jett.

She spent a majority of her time cheering on Lindsay and Cyril athletes, hanging out with her best friends—Martha, Betty, Barbara, and Kim, and spending time with her grandchildren. She was a lifetime member of the First Christian Church in Lindsay where she served as Chairman of the Board, Worship Leader, Youth Director, and Sunday School Teacher.

Cynthia was undeniably a woman of great character, faith, and kindness that never ceased. There were too many amazing qualities about Cynthia that could never be adequately expressed with words. All those that had the chance to be loved by such a wonderful woman know, wholeheartedly, that her genuineness, perseverance, and legacy will live on.
