Doris Cudd passed away on April 20, 2007. She was born in Edmond, Oklahoma in 1911, and graduated from Edmond High School and Central State College. She moved to Hughes in the 1930s to teach school and later taught in Lindsay. Doris started teaching school in Lindsay in the early 40s and continued her education at the University of Oklahoma where she earned a master degree. She retired from Lindsay schools in 1976. In her retirement she took care of her family and continued to work extensively in the First Christian Church in Lindsay, Oklahoma. She was married to Leo Cudd and had one daughter, Geneva.

Doris is preceded in death by her parents, husband and daughter.

She is survived by her grandchildren, David Perry of Norman, Oklahoma, Mark Perry of Duncan and Brad Perry of Lindsay, Oklahoma. She is also survived by her great-grandchildren, Britton, Madison, Lauren, Zachery, Patrick, Kirk, Ian, Hunter, and Tanner.
