Fannie Webb was born May 8, 1912. She was one of 14 children of Jim and Lou Henslee of the Banner Community. Fannie was preceded in death by her parents and 11 of her siblings. Fannie married R. G.(Johnny) Webb on May 16, 1937 at Banner. Together they had 9 children.
