Wagnon 1894 Tyler TX.-1926 Duncan OK; Father Monroe “Harold” Wagnon 1916 Duncan OK.-2004 Lindsay OK. and numerous Aunts & Uncles & cousins, etc. from each generation. If any of Brock’s family would like any further information on Brock’s family Wagnon line or would like to add more information on his family line to my research, my husband Richard’s email is rjwag44@hotmail.com. Richard’s family line was in VA. in 1758; ARK. 1819; TX. in 1855; Choctaw Nation Indian Territory OK. in 1876; Chickasha OK. 1888; then Foss OK. in Western OK. where his Grt grandfather Francis Lafayette “Fayette” Wagnon & his brother John Calvin Wagnon died at Foss in 1900 after contracting smallpox on a cattle drive into Old Mexico. If you have ever traveled west on I-40 between Clinton OK and Elk City OK. there is a Foss OK Cemetery where their graves are marked by 2 tall marble tombstones visible from I-40.
