



Harry Osco Miller

February 5, 1919 - April 16, 2005

Harry Osco Miller, born on February 5, 1919 at Pink, OK, was the oldest child of Carroll Arthur and Allie Ruth (Winegarner) Miller. He graduated from Lindsay High School in 1938 and attended Oklahoma State University. A veteran of World War II, Harry honorably served in the South Pacific Theater for 4 years. On January 15, 1947, he married Dorothy Lee Ballard and established his farming operation west of Lindsay. Harry was a 75 year member of the Lindsay United Methodist Church. He actively served as a local, county, and state leader in the Farm Bureau, FFA, 4-H, Soil Conservation Service, Cattlemen's Association, American Legion, and Boy Scout organizations. Harry, who in 1971 was honored as the Oklahoma Farmer and Rancher of the year by the Oklahoma Farm Bureau and WKY-TV, passed away on April 16, 2005 at Norman.

Harry was predeceased by his parents, his beloved wife, Dorothy, and his youngest son, Richard Mark Miller. He is survived by his son, Don, of Oklahoma City, daughter, Carol Vaught, of Mustang, and son, Stanley, and wife Kay, of Lindsay. He is also survived by five grandchildren: Brandon Miller and wife, Penny, of Lindsay, Joshua Miller, Lindsay, Jill and Jason Vaught of Mustang, Jade Miller, Lindsay; and three great-granddaughters: Miranda and Alanna Miller, and Hannah Vaught.

He is also survived by his younger sisters: Jo Frances Mays, and husband

Tommy, of Maysville, and Laura Sue Burford of Ft. Worth, Texas.

Funeral services for Harry O. Miller will be held on Wednesday, April, 20, 2005 at 2:00 p.m. at the United Methodist Church, Lindsay, Oklahoma. Interment will be at the Green Hill Cemetery, Lindsay, Oklahoma.
