Johnny Ray Webb was born in Lindsay, Oklahoma on November 2, 1955 to R.G. and Fannie Webb. Johnny was the youngest of nine children. After a long fight with cancer, he passed away in his home on January 11, 2009. Johnny was a 1974 Lindsay High School graduate as well as a graduate of Central State University where he was a member of the Sigma Tau Gamma Fraternity.

After twelve years in South Carolina, Johnny returned with his son Kolby to his home town of Lindsay regretfully leaving behind many dear friends from the Boiling Springs area. Johnny was currently employed with Weatherford International where he enjoyed his job and the people.

To know Johnny would be to know his great sense of humor and love for people. Never meeting a stranger, he always had a smile and a story to tell. When not riding his motorcycle, or telling his jokes, Johnny enjoyed following the Leopards to a football or baseball game.

Johnny was preceded in death by his parents, three brothers; Don, Bob and Jimmy Webb, a sister, Joy VanderSluis, three brothers-in-law; Raymond Aday, Willard McCartney and Tommy Ketchum and a niece, Mandy Ketchum.
