



Lavora Beatrice Dodd

July 7, 1925 - December 20, 2014

Lavora Beatrice Landers Dodd was born in Lindsay, OK on July 7, 1925 to Claude and Francis (Henry) England. She was the 3rd child of 8 plus one adopted sister. She married Wilton "Dick" Landers on March 2, 1942 at the age of 16. They had no children of their own, but she loved everyone else?s. She would kiss and bounce them till you?d think she?d churn their insides. She loved to dance and belonged to some square dance clubs. She was an excellent seamstress and made lots of her own can-cans and square dance dresses. She could look at a garment and go home and make it. She was a pocket person and added pockets to all her skirts, jackets and pants.

Lavora started work at Southwestern States as a telephone operator. They sold to General Telephone, and she was Chief Operator when they went dial. She moved to the business office on Chickasaw street. They phased out her job, and she couldn?t stay idle, so she went to beauty school and worked for Lucille Noles and Willie Franklin before she bought her own shop. After a while, she had the opportunity to buy the Ranch House Restaurant. She and Dick were co-owners with brother-in-law, Short Landers. She thought this would be fantastic because she would be able to eat Clara?s pies daily. Needless to say, it was WORK!. She then was presented the privilege of buying Butt?s Dress Shop. She was in her element here. She sold Merle Norman make-up and each year would get to go on a nice trip for conferences. She was a Gold Medallion Store and was awarded a plaque and

recognized for 30 years of being a studio owner.

Dick passed away in November 1991, and Lavora wed Al Dodd of Noble, OK at First Baptist Church in Lindsay in 1995. He had two daughters and their spouses and an adopted son. Lavora drove from Noble to her store in Lindsay for about 3 years. Al introduced her to cruises which she dearly loved. She lost Al on February 10, 2008.

Lavora was a member of the Lindsay Chamber of Commerce, the Red Hatters, Merle Norman Gold Medallion Club, American Legion Auxiliary and Winsome Sunday School Class. She loved to attend because they usually had good snacks and coffee. She liked to go to IBC Bank in the mornings for their great coffee with one to drink and one to go. After she wasn't able to drive, you'd see her hot footing it over to the City Office to enjoy their coffee or cappuccino, and she would usually stop back in on her way back from the post office or bank. One thing about Lavora everyone would agree on, she liked to give hugs and kisses. No matter the age or gender. We would warn her that some of the widowers might get the wrong idea, but it didn't stop her.

She held the title of oldest in the cousin generation of the Henry family. She was slightly older than her Aunt Bernice Springman. Lavora's mother, Francis, was the oldest Henry child. She really enjoyed the reunions at Rooster Creek, Texoma Lake, where she got to eat and dance and love on everybody.

Lavora made a profession of faith and dedicated herself to our precious Lord through baptism in the First Baptist Church on April 18, 1991. She went home to be with the Lord on Saturday, December 20, 2014 at Lindsay Municipal Hospital in Lindsay, Oklahoma at the age of 89. A reflection of Lavora's life is that she loved people and people loved her.
