Leonard Leon Hill of Lindsay, Oklahoma passed from this life Monday, November 24th, 2008 at Lindsay Manor Nursing home at the age of 75. He was born on March 8th, 1933 to Howard Houston Hill and Birdie Jane "Thomason" Hill in Turnbull, Oklahoma.

Mr. Hill was raised in Lindsay, Oklahoma, and graduated from Lindsay High School. He served his country in the United States Navy. He then moved to Dallas, Texas, where he graduated from the Dallas Police Academy. Mr. Hill joined the Dallas Police Department where he served as an officer for twenty-five years. He moved back to Lindsay, Oklahoma in 1983. Leonard married Mary E. "Fry" Wescott on October 21st, 1989 at Erin Springs Baptist Church in Lindsay, Oklahoma.
