



## Lola Mae Lindsay

January 11, 1921 - December 6, 2009

Lola Mae (Smith) Lindsay departed this life on December 6th, 2009 at her home in Lindsay, Oklahoma at the age of 88. Lola was born on January 11th, 1921 in Lindsay, Oklahoma to James Daniel (Jim) Smith and Ollie Ester (Duncan) Smith. She married C.O. "Frog" Lindsay on January 22nd, 1938 in Purcell, Oklahoma.
