Manley Henry Scruggs of Lindsay, Oklahoma, went to meet the Lord on Sunday December 16, 2007, at the age of 89 years old.

Manley was born October 13, 1918 to Henry Clyde Scruggs and Ethel Electra (Harris) Scruggs in Elmore City, Oklahoma. He was a sweet, gentle man with a loving smile, especially for his children and grandchildren. Even through his illness, Manley had a quick witty humor that brought a chuckle to those around him.
