February 10, 1927 - August 22, 2014

Marvin Parson Harrington was born in Depew, Oklahoma on February 10, 1927. He was the eldest child of Claude and Nellie Charlene (Holt) Harrington. Marvin was a diver during the construction of the Hoover Dam. He was also a World War II Veteran who served in the U.S. Army. When he was released from the military, he worked in the copper mines in Miami, Arizona where he met his wife. He married Daisy Green on February 22, 1946 in Silver City, New Mexico. Marvin and Daisy had four daughters, eight grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

Marvin loved hunting, fishing and dancing. He tried his best to hit every senior citizen dance hall. He would go to Marlow, Purcell and Chickasha weekly. He also loved pickin' and grinnin' so he could listen to and sing with Jane Reyes.

On the morning of August 22, 2014, Marvin passed away peacefully of natural causes. Marvin was being visited and comforted by family members at the home of his daughter, Charly Davidson in Chickasha, Oklahoma. At the time of his passing, Marvin was 87 years old.
