Phindle Ray Robbins of Lindsay, Oklahoma passed from this earthly life on Sunday, August 25, 2013 at Norman Regional Hospital in Norman, Oklahoma at the age of 88. “ I have a broomcorn story about Phindle. During the summer of 1945 or 1946, we were hauling broom corn to the thresher on the Max Bullock place north of Hughes. For the last load, Kenneth Williams and I did the loading and Phindle drove the tractor that pulled the wagon. As best I remember, Kenneth loaded the left side. I loaded the right. As we piled the cut broom corn higher and higher on the wagon, Phindle cautioned us to lap it more in the middle so it wouldn't slide off the float. Kenneth reminded Phindle that he would do the driving, he and Paul were quite capable of putting on a load that could make it to the broom corn shed. As we left the field, Phindle drove across a small gully on the side of the road, causing the wagon to lurch. The jolt threw half of the load to the ground. Twenty minutes later, with Phindle's help, we had it loaded back on the wagon. When we got to the broom corn shed, the threshing crew had just finished with the last load on the ground. Ben Chambers, our field boss, was getting ready to send another broom corn Johnny to check on us. I remember Phindle as being a hard worker and a funny guy to be around.
