R C Towery was born on November 12, 1922 in Kingsland, Arkansas to Ocine Towery and Lois (Childers) Towery. He later moved to Louisiana; where he enlisted to serve his country as a member of the United States Army during World War II, where he fought from D-Day to the Battle of Bulge. After the Army he met and married Esther Mae Towery (Perot) in Monroe, Louisiana on February 10, 1950. In 1962, R C moved to Lindsay, Oklahoma where he worked as a City Service Oilfield Company employee for Oxy until his retirement in 1983.

R C enjoyed spending his down-time outdoors hunting, fishing, and taking his grandchildren on a ride out in the country.
